To carry something - bawa (membawa)

'Membawa' is used to describe carrying things in a wide variety of contexts but Indonesians have some **very specialised verbs t**hat describe **how you carry**:-

Angkat to lift s.t. up & carry away

Angkut to carry cargo goods

Bopong to carry s.t. cradled in your

arms

Emban to carry s.t. (i.e. a baby)

slung in a cloth at front of

body

Gendong to carry s.t. on your hip or

in small of your back i.e.

penggendong jamu

Jinjing to carry s.t. hanging from

your hand whilst walking

Junjung to carry s.t. on your head

Panggul to carry s.t. resting on your

shoulders (hoe or rifle)

Pikul to carry things suspended

at each end of a bambu

pole

Pundit to carry s.t. respectfully

high above your head

Sandang

to carry s.t. on a strap, string or strip of cloth over

your shoulder

<mark>Sunggi</mark> Tanggung to carry s.t. on your head to carry s.t. (a tray) on the palm of your outstretched hand
