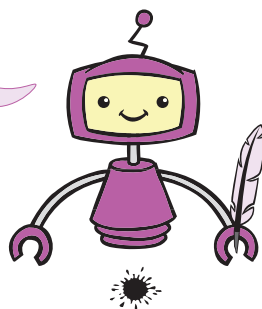


I have a dream

1 One day we'll fly away

In Work Sheet 3, *The open road*, you read a speech about one person's hopes and dreams for a better world.

In this work sheet, you will write a speech about your hopes and dreams. You will be asked to write about several different types of hopes and dreams for the future.

Let's find out about some of the different types of dreams you might have.

Personal dreams

Personal dreams are dreams you have about things, such as where you might live and what kind of home you might have. They could also be about your family and friends; or about personal aspirations. They might also include dreams about objects you would like to own, or hobbies, or non-professional sports you would like to pursue, such as surfing or horse riding.

Professional dreams

What do you want to be when you are an adult? What career, or careers, would you like to pursue? Perhaps you aren't sure exactly what kind of job you would like, but you know what kinds of work you'd like to do.

For example, you may like to work with native animals, or you may dream of working in a world-class research laboratory or of being a professional sportsperson.

National dreams

If you could influence the decisions made by your country's politicians and business leaders, what would you want them to change?

What role would you like Australia to play in the world? What would you like Australian culture and society to look like in the future? What about its landscape or architecture?

International dreams

Finally, what dreams do you have for the future of the world?

In Work Sheet 3, *The open road*, the speaker spoke about their dream of ending world hunger and poverty. Is this something you would like to see?

Perhaps you dream of a world in which there is no war, or where a particular social or environmental problem has been resolved.

Are you ready to dream? Great! Let's start exploring all those exciting dreams by using your creative skills to write an unforgettable speech!

Exercise 1

Preparation and planning

In this work sheet, your task will be to plan and write a speech expressing your hopes and dreams for the future. The speech will be written in Indonesian, but you may choose to do some of your planning in English.

The first step is to sketch out the speech by thinking about your hopes and dreams.

Make some notes about your dreams in each of the following categories. You will not need to refer to all of these hopes and dreams in your final speech.

1.1 What are your personal hopes and dreams?

1.2 What are your professional hopes and dreams?

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1.3 What hopes and dreams do you have for Australia's future?

1.4 What hopes and dreams do you have for the world's future?

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
