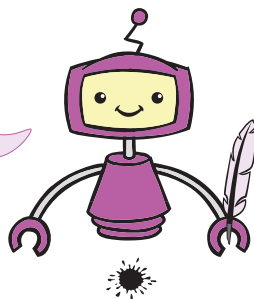


The ride of your life

1 Out of this world (or maybe not) ...

In Stage 2, Module 6, Work Sheet 1, *Very interesting*, and Module 15, Work Sheet 7, *Let the games begin*, you were introduced to a group of **meN~ ... ~kan** verbs based on adjectives which indicate an attitude or emotion. These verbs can also be used to express your feelings or opinions about rides at an amusement park. Let's explore some of these used in Learning Object 2, *Review and ride*.

<i>mengasyikkan</i>	exciting/great
<i>menggelikan</i>	amusing
<i>menyedihkan</i>	saddening
<i>membosankan</i>	boring
<i>menakutkan</i>	frightening

The suffix *~kan* has many different meanings. When *~kan* is attached to an adjective indicating emotion and the *me~* prefix is applied, you get words such as the following:

<i>kecewa</i>	disappointed
<i>mengecewakan</i>	disappointing
<i>puas</i>	satisfied
<i>memuaskan</i>	satisfactory
<i>malu</i>	embarass
<i>memalukan</i>	embarassing

The meaning of the construction with *~kan* is basically causative — it means causing someone to feel what the adjective describes.

Although structurally these words are verbs, they function like adjectives, and can be modified by adjective degree markers such as *sangat*, *kurang*, and *sekali*.

➔ For example:

<i>mengecewakan sekali</i>	very disappointing
<i>kurang memuaskan</i>	not very satisfactory
<i>sangat memalukan</i>	very embarassing

Lost for words
