

Interjections

Throughout the past ten modules, you have often heard the characters in 'New Land New Language' use words like *Wah!*, *Aduh!*, and *Keren!*.

These words belong to a group of words called interjections or exclamations. They are used to express emotions such as surprise, dislike, admiration or pleasure.

Interjections are followed by an exclamation mark and they always come at the beginning of the sentence in Indonesian.
